**ABSTRACT PREPARATION**

Please describe concisely your intended communication (background and perspective, motivation, main results, references...) in an abstract. Abstracts may contain equations and/or figures. They will be used for evaluation purposes. If accepted, they will then be included in the electronic version of the proceedings, to be provided to all participants at the time of the Conference.

The abstract length is limited to two A4 pages. To facilitate the preparation of the abstract, a LaTeX template and a Word template are provided. The submitted abstract must be in the form of a single PDF file of size less than 1MB.

**ABSTRACT SUBMISSION (deadline : November, 20<sup>th</sup> 2009)**

Please go to ECCM Web Site (<http://www.eccm2010.org/>) then select abstract submission/submit a new abstract.

There you will first be prompted to choose a suitable minisymposium (MS) for your paper, by browsing a list of topics :

Select:       **7       Uncertainty, probabilistic and stochastic approaches** then,  
Select:       **19       Robust design and uncertainty**

Upon choosing a MS, you will be requested to enter all authors (one at a time) followed by the abstract title, and finally to upload the PDF file of your abstract.

Please note the following important instructions:

a/ Any individual submitting an abstract must already have an account in the ECCM website, and hence should create beforehand his/her personal account prior to submission if necessary. In the latter case, please accept any certificate issued by the ECCM 2010 website; this is entirely safe.

b/ The person submitting the abstract is the default corresponding author, and has the possibility to designate another co-author as corresponding author.

c/ It is mandatory to designate a presenting author. This choice may be modified later, at any time before end of registration, by the corresponding author (i.e. another co-author may be later designated as the presenting author).

d/ No participant will be allowed to present more than one paper (with the exception of speakers presenting plenary or semi-plenary lectures, who will be allowed to present one other paper).
